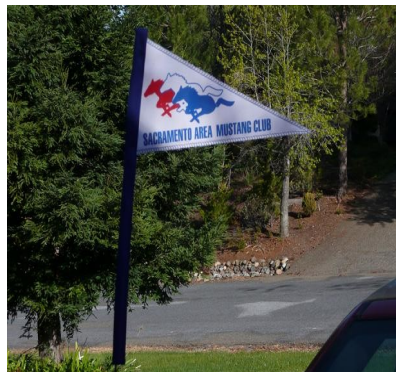

John opened the meeting, welcomed members and guests. He announced that Bob Keller, car show chairman is hard at work with preliminary work leading up to Mustangs & Fords in the Park car show. He asked members to step way out of their comfort zone and volunteer for some of the assignments that lead up to the show. He noted that members always step up in good numbers on show day and the great successes we accomplish are through the hard work and dedication but we need lots of help in the month's prior. We have four months to do this and if everyone lends a hand it will be very light work on a person by person basis, stretched over this long period leading up to the show day. Bob has sign-up sheets available tonight to put your names down for contact.

John welcomed newly approved members Wayman Yee, Clifford & Juliann Willard, Fred Williams, Larry Anderson, Roseanna Ramirez and ;Dylan Brown.

Vic announced that there are no December minutes to approve due to no December general meeting.

Jacque reported a treasury balance this evening of \$4468.48. This includes dues collected and payments made as of last week's board meeting. She is also taking dues payments this evening. John asked for members to approved refunds to Ron & Cindy Bramlett, Bob & Linda Seawell and Dylan Brown for \$16 since they were unable to attend the Christmas party and Cattlemen's Restaurant didn't charge us for their dinners. The total was \$80. Membership approved.

Robert R. reported a membership count of 28 for the new year and the approval of the new members mentioned by John earlier in the meeting. John reminded members to pay their dues this evening or by mailing to the club PO Box or by next month's meeting.

Norm outlined some of the changes made to the website in the past couple of weeks: more picture links, newsletters, forms, schedules, officer directory.

Jane announced that she has set a tentative date with Chuck Wiltens of Bay Area Mustang Assoc (BAMA) to do a judging seminar for our members. The date is 4/9 at Larry's shop, JT's Mustang & Performance. The seminar will teach us how to better prepare our cars for an MCA judge car show. Chuck is an MCA Gold Card Judge. Larry asked members to help him prepare his shop prior to our event.

Vic asked Membership to approve the expense of \$125 for our club's annual membership to the California Auto Museum (C.A.M.) foundation. Membership approved. Benefits of membership are the same as last year: Admission to the museum for those posted on our club's roster held at C.A.M.'s front desk, participation in the annual Car Club Trim-A-Tree potluck dinner and admission for two of our members (of our choice) to attend C.A.M.'s Annual Banquet.

John asked members to approve the expense of up to \$2500 for the Mustangs and Fords in the Park car show. Some discussion was held as to whether this would be enough as we spent almost \$3300 last year. David, last years chairman offered his opinion that this year's expenses wouldn't be as high and \$2500 should work. He also reminded members that \$843 of seed money is earmarked on the budget and is part of the \$2500. Vic reminded members that we can re-evaluate the amount in the months to come if the need were to arise. Membership voted approval.

John passed out a flyer for a '66 Mustang for sale. See Clifford Willard for more details.

Lorrie outlined some of our upcoming events: Calif Zephyr snow train ride from Roseville to Reno, Thurs, 2/24-Friday 2/25, overnight stay at El Dorado Hotel, make your own reservations and arrangements. MCA Judging Seminar, Sat 4/9 at Larry's shop, JT's Mustang and Performance; Down's Syndrome Car show at Auburn Gold Country Fairgrounds, Sat 5/14, we are considering the possibility of volunteering some help to the promoters,; Golden Hills Mustang Club's Biggest Little Car show at the Suisun City Water front Park Sat 5/21, Ford Lovers West Coast Nationals at Sacramento Raceway Sat, 5/21. Lorrie also reminded members that we have our Driving Event to Capay Valley Almond Festival on Sun, 3/13 and driving event to Daffodil Hill on Sun 3/20. More details on these two later.

Lisa was suffering with laryngitis so Kevin reminded members to submit as may pictures, articles, for sale ads or whatever else to Lisa at email 2lisaplz@att.net by the 27th of each month.

Robert K. reported that our Mustangs and Fords in the Park car show park reservation is now confirmed with Cordova Park Dis. The fee is \$450. There was some confusion as to whether we have the baseball field reserved as well. Bob will confirm this. We have car show flyers completed and printed in color for 8 cents each—really a good deal from a shop in Modesto. Mike Roby is sponsoring the President's Choice Trophy for the show. Auto Lab is again, one of our sponsors.

Larry covered the plans for the Kings game vs. Utah Jazz on Sun, 4/3. We'll be able to display 8-10 cars up by the will-call box offices. Pre-game lunch is at Mtn. Mikes at Arena Blvd & Truxel Rd at 12.00. Ticket price is \$37.50 for \$79 lower level seats. Tickets can be paid for tonight or by mail to the SAMC PO Box but no later than at our Feb 16th General Meeting. Call Larry or Vic for details.

Vic asked for approval of the \$200 of his funds spent to place the good-faith deposit with the Kings sales rep, Rob Lunder. Membership approved. Larry asked for a show of hands and approx. 20 members showed interest in attending the game. Larry and Lorrie are preparing a flyer to generate more interest. If we sell 50 tickets we'll receive a \$50 food/beverage voucher and if we sell 100 we'll receive two future Kings Row tickets. These items will be raffled to those in attendance— all the more reason to come.

John asked members to consider supporting both the Golden Hills MC Biggest Little Car Show at Suisun City Water front Park and Larry's Ford Lovers West Coast Nationals event. They are both being held on the same day, Sat 5/21 but we have enough members with varying interests to make a significant attendance at both. He plans to have leaders for both events to insure a good turn-out.

Larry asked to have the floor and thanked the membership for all of their past support. He mentioned that members who come out to help out at "Ford Lovers West Coast Nationals" will receive a nice discount, special "Staff" shirt, BBQ lunch in addition to the other stuff and good times that all the regular participants get.

Round Table: Craig would like to organize a Dyno Day at the AEB Tuners Shop in Cameron Park. It was suggested that we set a date when we organize events for the second half of the year. The cost is \$500 total which would be split amongst the participants approx. \$50 each.

George brought his 5' wide panoramic photo to share that he received from his attendance at the Mustang's Northwest MCA Grand Nationals in Bellevue, WA this past summer. The photo has all the 350+ cars attending the Pony Trails event.

David announced that he has tickets for sale for the AACA Spaghetti Feed fund raiser event held at C.A.M. on Sun, 2/27 benefitting lobbying efforts to protect car collectors and enthusiasts from laws and regulations that limit our use, licensing and enjoyment of our cars. Mike Roby has SAMC logo decal sand Larry ahs club logo pennants and some apparel for sale. David asked people interested in going to Sierra City this coming late summer for the Big City Car show to see him after the meeting.

Mike Roby reminded members that the NSRA car show being held at the Cal Expo fairground this coming October is now open to cars up to '81 model year. It's a fun, three day event.

Kathy ran the raffle, collected a total of \$98. Jane won \$49 in the 50/50 drawing and other \$49 was given to treasurer, Jacquie.

Minutes of the Sacramento Area Mustang Club board meeting.

Those in attendance: John Davenport, David Slayton, Vic Bustabade, Jacquie Dosch, Lorrie Calzoni-Greene, Matthew Calzoni, Michael Throne, Jane Crowden, Robert Rocha, Lisa Williams, Kevin Williams, Larry Steuckrath, Norm Axtell, Fred Williams, Mike Reha.

John opened the meeting and welcomed board members new and old.

Larry introduced Rob Lunder/Sac Kings sales rep. He gave the following details for our group's attendance at the Sun, 4/3 game vs. Utah Jazz: The game is at 3:00, we can park up to 10 cars near the will call entrance to the arena at 12:00. The tickets are \$37.50 each for \$79 lower level seats. If we get 50 people we get a \$50 food & beverage voucher and if we get 100 people we get 2 future Kings row seats. Vic suggested that these two giveaways could be raffled to those attending in order to entice more people to attend and have a little game of chance fun. Rob also mentioned that the seats are better than last years. He asked us to do a deposit of \$200 to get things started. Larry will contact Rob tomorrow and Vic will pay the deposit since we don't have general membership approval for the deposit.

John read the club credo.

Vic asked for approval of minutes as emailed to board members last month. Lisa mentioned that they were posted in the newsletter as well. No issues noted, board approved.

Jacquie reported a checking balance of \$4194.61. There's a \$4 discrepancy and she'll track it down before next week. Apparently it was gathered up at the end of the Nov general meeting and never made it to the PO Box in the mean time John reinstated the PO box so we should be good to go.

John asked for board approval to refund \$16 each for Ron & Cindy Bramlett, Bob & Linda Seawell and Dylan Brown as they were unable to attend the Christmas party and Cattlemen's did not charge for their dinners. Board approved.

Robert R. said he was unable to give a membership report at this time as he is just getting started with the materials given to him by Norm. He asked for board approval of new member applicants, Larry Anderson, Rosanna Ramirez, Wayman Yee, Clifford & Julianne Willard and Fred Williams. Board approved. Vic asked Robert to send him and other board members names and email address of new members as they are added to the rolls. He said he would, once he gets board member's addresses. John reminded Robert that they're posted in the newsletter and the website.

John reminded the board members that the 27th of each month is the deadline for newsletter article submissions. Lisa asked Lorrie if she could change the format of the Event Calendar so that there is a sequential listing. Lorrie agreed and will send it to Lisa and Norm.

John announced that the Down's Syndrome car show will happen this year in spite of the problems encountered last year. It will be a one day affair held on Sat, 5/14 at the Auburn Gold Country Fairgrounds.

John announced that ACCC, Camaro Generations and some other clubs are considering the possibility of a get together on the Saturday during the Autorama. More details to follow. One board member suggested we check out RPM go-kart raceway as a possible location. Craig asked board to consider more events for the latter part of this year and provide them to Lorrie. John said he is going to have Lorrie make up some event suggestion forms and he is going to provide a half hour during the March general meeting to lay out events in the July-December time period, instead of having a separate event planning meeting.

Lorrie is going to send out an Event Notice for the Thunder Valley brunch in the next couple of days. Lorrie asked for a good list of members so she can build an email contact list. Vic said he will send his as it is fairly well up to date.

Robert K. reviewed some of the times on his list for M&FITP XV: monthly to-do list, goodie bag item procurement, flyers, announcement letter to past attendees, vendors advertising. He will be contacting Cordova Park Dist to see if we are now confirmed for Sat 6/11. John is looking into providing two port-potties and a half page ad in Crusin' News for \$125. Larry is going to go on air with John Sweeney on Cruising' Talk Radio Show on Talk 650 AM using Bill Logan's gift certificate for the Purpose. John said it has to be before the end of the month. David announced that the ACCC is going to have a spaghetti Feed at Sacramento Vintage Ford on Sun, 2/27 to raise funds for support of efforts to prevent legislation of bills unfriendly to car collectors and enthusiasts. Larry mentioned that he spoke with Doug Beisner, Jim & Marcia's son regarding his recent serious bicycle accident. Doug hopes to be back in business at Sierra Woodworks in a couples of weeks in spite of his Dr's longer recover estimate. Doug also is looking for somebody to buy Jim's '64 Ranchero for \$1000.
