Let's take the train The California Zephyr from her to Reno and experience the winter beauty of the Sierra Nevada mountain range from a completely different perspective. The California Zephyr is an interesting train. It was started in 1949 with an inaugural run from the Embarcadero of San Francisco to Chicago, IL. The trip takes a little over 49 hours. We had docents from the Sacramento Railroad Museum on board narrating the many spectacular sites of this route. Our trip went as far as Reno.

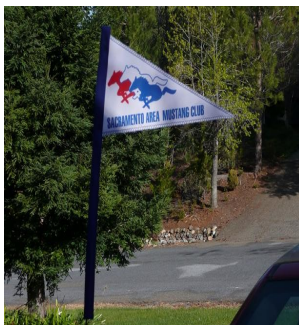

For Sale by Members: A used set of Hooker Competition Long Tube Exhaust Headers. Model 6901 for 1964 1/2—1970 Ford Mustang with 289 or 302 V8. They are ceramic coated with 3 in 3 bolt flanged collectors and 1 5/8 in primary tubes. They fit my car perfectly. I ran them in my car for about 6 years and 10,000 miles. The reason for removal - I lowered my car's suspension, it experienced some scraping on driveways and speed bumps. Only damage to them was some scratching at the bottom near the collectors. If you have a car without radical lowering like mine, they should do just fine. Also including exhaust pipe and X-pipe assembly. That assembly bolts to the collectors and runs back to where you would weld in your mufflers and tail pipes. Contact Vic 916 624-8558. Price \$125 or BO, cash only, you pick up.

John opened the meeting. He introduced Phil Hamilton from RPM Photo Art. He gave a status on Jane Crowden's post operative progress since her knee surgery a couple of weeks back. He also commented on our get togethers with other Sacramento clubs across the street from Cal Expo this past Saturday. He asked guests and visitors to introduce themselves, Jack Nixon, Fred's friend Ashley, Norm's friend David and new member applicant, Eric.

Craig read the club credo.

Phil Hamilton from RPM Photo Art introduced his business partners, John Johnson, Brian Hamilton and Bev McKinnis. They showed a good number of items that can be custom designed, including posters, placards, shirts, blankets, embroidered apparel, calendars and license plates. John mentioned that a portion of their profits go to adoption and foster care charities. They asked members to complete some survey forms looking for our wants and needs. Bob Keller asked to speak with them later to discuss t-shirts for the upcoming car show.

Vic asked for approval of the minutes as posted in the newsletter. Members approved and no issues noted. John also mentioned that we will no longer post minutes of the board meetings in the newsletter. Only the general meeting minutes will be posted. Members can request a copy of board minutes, if interested.

Robert reported a membership count of 39 primary and 25 associate members at this time. He received approximately 10 additional member applications this evening thus the count will be higher once they are processed.

Norm asked members to please send him some pictures of member cars for the website. He also has improved the presentation of pictures on the website.

Vic reported the treasury status in Jacquie's absence. We have a balance of \$4500.89. Our spendable balance is \$3638.67 after removing the \$843 earmarked for car show seed money. John shared that we received a statement letter from Cosumnes River College showing our money, \$2000 on account for the Ford ASSET Scholarships. Vic will file it with club records. Vic reminded members that he can take any monies or write checks from/to members for membership, car show, Kings tickets or what ever other club business in place of Jacquie this evening.

John made a presentation on the Crusin' for Downs Syndrome car show. It will be held on 5/14 at the Gold Country Fairgrounds in Auburn. He asked members to consider signing up to help the show promoter do registration, sell tickets, park cars etc. We can also show our cars as well as volunteering our help. Sign-up sheets were circulated. We will need to arrive early. John suggested meeting somewhere in Sacramento at 5:45. FYI, the show has no admission charge for spectators.

Jane was unavailable to provide an MCA update this evening due to her being in the hospital.

Robert Rocha gave a presentation on an idea he suggested to the board last week to promote a greater level of members leading club events. If a member volunteers to be a leader, his or her name will be placed in a drawing. At the end of the year, at the Christmas party, the winning member will receive a customized car club jacket valued at approximately \$75 or an equivalent valued prize of their own choosing. Members will have one ticket in the drawing, regardless of how many times they volunteer. John mentioned that volunteering multiple times still has its advantages because that will limit the number of tickets in the drawing. We canvassed the members for upcoming events and received the following volunteers: Daffodil Hill drive, John; Capay Almond Fest, Vic; Georgetown VFW breakfast & visit to Folsom Powerhouse SHP, Bob Keller; Mustang Plus April Car Display, Bill LaPalia; Diablo Valley Mustang Assoc car show at Prewitt Waterpark in Antioch, Bill Logan.

Lorrie asked members to give a summary of past events. Norm, breakfast at Thunder Valley; Michael, Autorama get together; Craig, Autorama and Bob Seawell his autorama class winning experience. Lorrie summarized the upcoming events and their dates. She is preparing a new event calendar to be more easily posted in the newsletter and website.

John asked members if they had interest in attending a show 'n' shine hosted by Sierra College Auto Club. They are also conducting a welding expo along with the car show on the campus. The date is 4/16 9:00-4:00. John will contact and provide details next month.

John announced that Kevin will be putting together some materials for the "Flat Mustang" project. The St Louis Mustang Club has put together this children's activity similar to "Flat Stanley" ed note: I'm assuming we as a club will take our flat Mustang with us on drives and outings and photograph the Mustang in various places in our area to share with the kids that St Louis MC is supporting.

Mustangs and Fords in the Park. Bob gave status on the following: We have all but 6 class trophy plaques and 2 large trophies now sponsored. Norm is busy emailing vendors for raffle prize and goodie bag donations. John is going to store raffle prizes as well as catalog and number them before the event. Maaco No. Highlands is donating our raffle grand prize. Club members were asked to be generous and provide a raffle prize as well as volunteering to help out before and during the event. John thanked Mike & Darlene and Vic & Lynn for their trophy sponsorship donations.

Larry was unavailable this evening. The Calif Zephyr train excursion is going on as scheduled for 2/24-25 with over night in Reno . The Kings ticket sale ends this evening. Vic will provide Larry with the number of tickets needed and Larry will order accordingly. We sold more than enough tickets to cover our \$200 deposit.

John canvassed members to see if we could get enough members to form a small committee to come up with some good new ideas for club apparel. Norm, Matthew, Fred and Lorrie volunteered. John shared a letter from C.A.M. seeking cars for their upcoming Muscle Car Display. Those displaying their cars will have to do so for 90 days unless they would like to team up with others for periods within the 90 days. See John for details.

Round Table. Clifford has \$9.95 oil change coupons from Big O Tires available. Fred met a representative from the A.C.C.C. at Autorama. They are trying to work with Calif legislature to limit laws affecting the car collector hobby. David mentioned that we are supporting them by attending some of their meetings and their upcoming spaghetti feed fund raiser. Clifford asked if there is a way for him to receive information on club activities since he doesn't have internet access. Vic took his address to set him up for mail delivery of the newsletter. He also provided him with a copy of the Feb issue.

Raffle. Kathi collected a total of \$38.00. I missed the winner of the 50/50. \$19.00 was handed over to Vic for treasury deposit.

These are some great rules to follow when setting up a trip with a group of Mustangers. The rules are flexible and you may modify for the type of event to fit what is needed but these are the basics:

1. If you are the trip organizer, call everyone on the sign up list 1 to 2 nights before as a reminder.
2. Be on time; the entire mood of a SAMC trip can be soured by waiting around at the departure point for "no shows" or late arrivals. You should be at the departure point at least 15 minutes early to allow for a briefing and passing out of directions, etc.
3. Call if you have signed up and can't attend.
4. When on the road, turn on your headlights. It makes it easier to stay in contact on crowded highways.
5. The lead and trail car should be in radio or cell phone contact whenever possible to help keep the group together and set the pace.
6. Every car should be provided with written directions in case of separation, include a meeting point at the destination.
7. Obey the speed limit and all other traffic laws.
8. Leaders watch your mirrors and pay attention. Don't be afraid to pull over and regroup when the cars begin to string out and lose contact, or when the group is separated by traffic lights. (Make sure you pick a safe place to do this!)
9. Board members: make every effort to ensure that the calendar is updated, especially on the web site, with contact and departure details.
10. Be careful and have fun!!! (And remember, for you early model owners, turn off your headlights when you reach your location.)
11. GAS, get gas before the trip begins. You don't want to be "that guy".
