Please join us Sun, Oct 10th from 10am –2pm for the annual All Mustang Picnic. This is our end-of-year picnic/potluck social where it's the people, not the cars that is the focus. SAMC is hosting this year and we have invited guests from a number of Nor Cal Mustang clubs to join us. Our location, Mather Regional Park features a 5 acre lake, large new picnic area, grass play area and lots of playground stuff for the kids. The lake is suitable for kayaks/rafts etc, but not many fish left I hear. (A license if required). There is easy parking, which the county asks \$5 to use, like most all parks do now. There are some semi wild ducks and geese around to feed or chase if you want, but wouldn't ya all like a little BBQ goose this year? It could happen.... You may begin to gather anytime after about 10am and we'll have the feedbags on by noon. I'd encourage you to bring an inexpensive raffle prize \$10 max. We'll be selling raffle tickets to help cover our expenses. We may even try to organize some games or other suitable entertainment for your recreational, Norm will provide us with music. The SAMC will provide the main course, condiments, drinks, tableware and utensils. You supply side dishes. Please bring a serving for 6 people as follows: Last names A-I bring dessert, J-R bring salads, coleslaw, macaroni etc, R-A bring appetizers chip/dips, nuts, fruit etc. This will allow us to consume mass quantities for a long period. Please RSVP Vic or Craig so we know how much food and supplies to buy. Directions: From Hwy 50 in Sacramento, head east towards South Lake Tahoe, exit south on Sunrise Blvd in Rancho Cordova. Go south a couple miles to signal at Douglas Rd, turn Rt (west) past the gun range 1/2 mile to Eagles Nest Rd, turn left, go 1/4 mile to park. Call me at 916 974-0977 for info. See ya there!!!

John called the meeting to order at 7:00. Kevin read the club credo. John welcomed new members Matt and Laurie Calzone. He also mentioned some newly approved members not in attendance this evening, Brendon Carvalho, Dillon Brown and Jim & Judy Frank. He announced that the board has a proposition regarding the Christmas party that members should find as good news. Board recommends that that we discount the cost for dinner by \$10. This would make the net cost per person \$16. Additionally, the club will purchase \$300 worth of raffle prizes for that evening. Members voted approval of both. John gave an overview of Randy Moore's memorial service and commented on Rob Moore's thank you message to all of us. He also thanked members for attending. A collection was started by David for the American Diabetes Assoc and a sympathy card was circulated for folks to sign. John and Larry announced details on the fall season apparel offering, a blue hoodie sweatshirt with club logo and owner's name embroidered for \$25 S-XL and \$27 for 2X-3X. Several members asked for black instead of blue. A decision was made to change the color to black. A sign-up sheet was distributed and money was collected. People who couldn't pay this evening were told that the club treasury will pay for theirs but they are obligated to buy and pay for the sweatshirt if they sign up tonight. The shirts will be delivered at the October meeting. John announced that Robert Rocha and Joe Foft will be administering the SAMC Face Book page. Larry expressed some issues regarding members privacy. After discussion John requested, in order to provide privacy, Robert and Joe will be the only one's to insert pictures. John asked members to let Robert or Joe know if they have any issues about their privacy. Norm will post a link on our website to Face Book. Members approved.

Vic asked for member approval of last month's meeting minutes as posted in the newsletter. Members approved.

Jacque reported a checking balance of \$6981 and a net spendable balance of \$4183.50 after considering earmarked monies and upcoming projected expenses. She provided a copy of her report to officers.

Norm reported a membership count of 113 with 74 primary and 39 associate members. He also has all of the club car pictures he has received posted onto the website.

Jane passed around a clipboard and asked members to give input on any questions or issues for her to bring to the MCA regional directors meeting in Dallas this Oct. Also, John reminded members who belong to the MCA to vote using the ballot received in the September issue of Mustang Times. He also recommended that members not vote for candidates, Orr, Mays or Hampton as they favor regressive policies for the MCA.

The All Mustang Picnic was discussed. It will be held at Mather Regional Park near So. Sunrise and Douglas Rd in Rancho Cordova. The club will provide meat items, tableware and drinks. Attendees will provide side dishes, appetizers, deserts, salads, etc according to their last name alphabetical assignment. A proposition to spend up to \$250 on club provided food items was brought forward. Members voted approval. Vic will purchase food and organize the cooking team. Norm will provide DJ services. Members were asked to bring prizes for the raffle.

John asked for member approval to spend a total of \$70 to provide prizes (\$50 in cash and \$20 in apparel items) for the poker run to Georgetown this Sunday. Members approved.

Vic reported on his and John's visit to Cal Auto Museum to deliver the \$1300 check donated from part of our car show proceeds. We have an adoption status of three of their cars, Ricky Nelson's Mustang convertible, a '69 Boss 302 Mustang and Clara Ford's (Henry's widow) Lincoln. We also no longer need passes to enter the museum. They will check off members from a roster we have provided to them. Norm is also going to send an updated roster to them so they have an up-to-date roster.

Craig gave an overview of past events, Fun Ford Sunday and All American Car Show @ Future Ford – Sacramento. He summarized the following upcoming shows: Larry running his race car at Pinks – All Out TV show filming at Infineon drag strip, Uncork the Cobra wine tasting event and car show at Perry Creek Winery, Georgetown VFW pancake breakfast poker run and trip to Folsom Prison Museum, Big City Rod Run car show at Sierra City (he has some rooms available), Vacaville Nut Tree Mustang Days Fly-in and Car Show, All Mustang Picnic, Camaro Generations Muscle Car Show at Elk Grove Park and Mustangs Plus October Car Display.

John thanked Lisa for the great newsletter she produced this month. She said that she'll be on a vacation between now and next month's due date (9/27) so members please try to send any pictures, information or articles as soon as possible. Michael Throne was complemented for his article on the Horses and Feathers Picnic. Lisa also announced that the Halloween Party she and Kevin are hosting will be held on Sat, 10/30 (Editor's note—changed to Oct 29th).

New Business

John announced that David will be conducting the October meeting in his absence. During that meeting we will take nominations and volunteers for club officers and committee chair people for 2011. Vic will provide the form to do this. FYI, the election will be held at the November meeting.

Vic asked members for input as to whether those in attendance tonight were interested in showing their cars at the 2011 Autorama. Bob Seawell was the only member responding this evening. He went on to explain that we need to start the process by identifying those willing to participate before we go through the process of applying and planning. John said he'll contact Mike Reha to see if he is willing to act as our advance man for contacting the show promoter, John Buck Enterprises.

Vic introduced a proposition to membership, start event planning for 2011 in November. Larry suggested Sat, 11/13. Vic liked the idea and will schedule a place to do this. He will circulate an "event idea" form and sign-up sheet at the October meeting. Subsequent to meeting Vic discovered that the 11/13 date conflicted with McClellan museum event and changed date to Thur, 10/28.

David announced the Randy Moore collection netted \$124. He proposed that the club fund an additional \$76 to make the total donation to the Diabetes Assoc be \$200. Members voted approval.

Automotive Shop Safety—Part 7 in a series by James Hill MOVING SURFACES

Mechanics often get lax when working around motors. They forget that any moving surface can "grab" something loose like clothing and the grab can pull a limb into the movement. There's little protection beyond paying attention to what you're doing and don't get fingers or hands anywhere near a moving belt and it is unfortunate that the auto generator is often driven by a belt. If you have to work around a generator or any other belt-driven appliance, try to shut off the motor before getting into the area.

If you are under the car, know that the driveshaft, if running, can catch clothing and pull you into it. The power system has enough force that it can rip your clothing and even a limb, so don't do anything dumb while near anything that is moving. You have similar capability in a moving wheel although that is not nearly so prevalent.

The fan associated with radiator and water pump can act like a cutter. Get a hand into it and it can batter a hand touching it from the rear; touching from the front could cause a bad cut because even a dull blade cuts if it's moving fast. If the fan is electric know that it can start up at any time because it is controlled by a thermostatic switch, and they don't ask permission.

Jewelry anywhere on a person can get caught in anything moving or can scratch a surface. And buttons or belt buckles on a person's front or arms can scratch a fine surface. Just don't get them near the car. (Continued next month—shop tools)

Minutes of the Sep 8th Board meeting.

Those in attendance: John Davenport, Dave Slayton, Vic Bustabade, Jacquie Dosch, Norm Axtell, Mike Roby, Mike Reha, Kevin Williams. Also in attendance: Lisa Williams, Bob Keller, Craig Fairchild.

John called the meeting to order and made these announcements. Randy Moore's memorial service is Saturday this weekend. John ordered and received a check endorsement stamp for Jacquie to use with the new account. Jane was unable to attend due to her mom's health emergency. He asked board members to submit any questions or concerns to her for the MCA director's conference. Also she recommended that we not vote for Robin Orr, Charles Hampton or Jeff Mays for MCA Board of Directors. The ballot for this vote is in the Mustang Times that arrived to members this week. John also asked for some advice on where to find the blue hoodie sweat shirt we need for our fall apparel offering as Larry was unable to find anything yet. Jacquie is going to check at JC Penney's where she can get a discount from her mom. He also asked Vic who was the vendor we used for the Dickie "Ike" jackets. It was Gael Inc, now know as Minnesota Workwear Inc also Wal-Mart carries them.

Jacquie read the club credo.

Vic asked board to approve last month's minutes as emailed. Board approved.

Norm reported a member count of 72 primary and 36 associate members. He asked for board approval of Jim & Judy Frank and Brendon Carvalho. Board voted approval.

Jacquie reported a checking balance of \$6965.19. Our adjusted available balance after projected obligations and held-back monies is \$4117.19. She distributed copies of her report to board members to review.

Norm announced that he now has over 30 club car photos on the website. John asked if there was a way to speed up the presentation of the cars, possibly using thumbnail photos and then the full-blown image appearing. Norm said he's trying but hasn't found an easy way to do that yet.

Old and Continuing Business

Lisa gave a summary of the newsletter sent out today. Vic mentioned that they were emailed and US mailed. They required additional postage due to the weight and size wise, the 14 pages was at our limit for mailing. New writers in this edition, Michael Throne and Bob Keller, good job. John reminded everyone that the 27th of the month is Lisa's deadline.

Craig went over the upcoming events: Fun Ford Sunday and Future Ford (Madison Av) car show, filming of Pinks TV show at Infineon Raceway, Perry Creek Winery's Uncork the Cobra car show, Georgetown VFW pancake breakfast and drive to Folsom Prison museum with poker run, Nut Tree car show in Vacaville, All Mustang Picnic, Camaro Generations car club's Muscle Car Show and Mustang Plus October Car Display.

John introduced two propositions for our club Christmas party, either \$6 discount on dinner and \$500 worth of raffle prizes or \$10 discount and \$300 worth of raffle prizes. His analysis indicates that either option is well within our treasury's means. After much discussion, the board reached the conclusion of the \$10/\$300 option. It would give the members a good break on the \$25 meal cost thus insuring a large turn-out and make it a bit easier for the raffle person to do the shopping. John will seek general member approval of this at next week's meeting.

John produced a document from the State of Ca titled Statement of Information for Non-Profit Corporations. He is concerned that we may need to renew this before Nov, 2010. It appears that this needs to be done every two years. Our original date was Nov, 1994 thus every even year should be where it should be done. The cost appears to be \$20 to renew. Vic said he will go through his records and see when it was last done. Subsequent to meeting, Vic found the last renewal to be done Oct, 2008 and signed by Robert Banks.

Some discussion was held regarding a memorial donation by the club membership to the Diabetes Foundation in memory of Randy Moore. After discussion of whether or not we should match club funds to those donated by individual members, it was decided that David will make appeals to individual members at next week's meeting. After totaling the money collected, we will decide to make a companion donation of club funds. The primary concern was that we might not be able to do this in each and every situation based on the club's financial position at the time.

John displayed A red carry bag and a blue barbeque apron with club logo to be awarded as poker run prizes along with \$25 each. The bag will be the gal prize and the apron will be the guy prize. We will have two separate games so all members will have a chance at a prize. Board decided that we will ask for membership approval of \$70 to cover \$10 each for the bag and apron and the two \$25 cash prizes.

Board Minutes Continued

Round Table: Board approved the purchase of 4 money changer aprons with club logo to be used for car show, picnic or any other event we sell tickets. Cost 48.50 each, total \$34, board voted approval. Jacquie asked for approval of purchase of check endorsement stamp for \$22.50 previously purchased by John, board approved. Mike Roby reminded the board that NSRA is expanding their participation to 1980 and older cars this year.

Addendum: After the board meeting, John contacted members by email to ask for approval for a proposal to combine one of the member at large positions with the Event Coordinator position. Board voted 6 in favor.

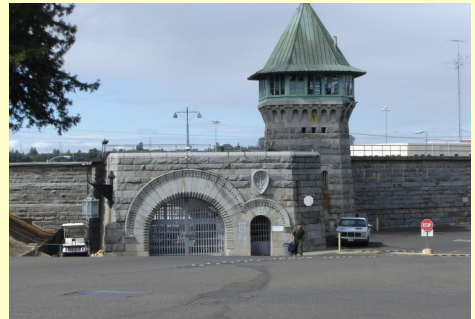
Georgetown Breakfast and Cruise to Folsom Prison Museum
